Reports

Twice a year, teachers report on student achievement based on assessments and information collected about student learning. Our teachers have been working hard to write extensive reports that cover all Key Learning Areas. These subjects have been assessed through a range of techniques, with student's abilities compared to relevant syllabus outcomes for each Stage of learning. Kindergarten student achievement is assessed against a three point scale, with 'Achieving' being the expected achievable outcome. Students in Years 1-6 are assessed against a five point scale with 'Sound', being the expected achievable outcome.

I would like to congratulate the students of Cringila Public School on their fantastic achievements and conscientious efforts towards learning throughout Semester Two. Please take the time to celebrate your child's successes with them and discuss areas they may need to improve. K-6 Science and Planetarium Excursion


Next Monday, the students of Cringila Public School will be visiting the Science Centre and Planetarium located at the University of Wollongong's Innovation Campus. Students will spend two hours at the centre and will have the opportunity to explore over 100 interactive exhibits which demonstrate science, engineering and technology in action as well as more exhibits on dinosaurs, fossils, illusions, motors and electricity. We will watch both a science show and a planetarium show.
